### *HOUSE WINES*

#### **White Wines**

1 Chenin Blanc, Coastal Region, Klippenkop S Africa 2005  
*South Africa's most popular white grape has produced this off-dry wine with a slightly honeyed character*

2 Hardys VR Chardonnay Australia 2005  
*A fresh wine with aromas of peach, honey and floral completed by a mineral, citrus streak. Round, smooth and soft with a touch of sweetness*

#### **Red Wines**

3 Cabernet Sauvignon, CYT, Central Valley Chile 2005  
*Ever popular Cabernet Sauvignon, here unoaked, produces an easy going flavoursome wine with appealing berry aromas*

4 Hardys VR Shiraz Australia 2005  
*Intense and warm with a savoury finish. Spicy aromas streaked with a mix of blackberry and blueberry fruit.*

#### **Rose**

5 Rioja Rosado, Bodegas Sonsierra Spain 2005  
*Yes, you can have a pink Rioja, Rosado. From the traditional red Tempranillo grapes, lightly pressed to leave a 'glass of fruit salad'.*

10	Muscadet de Sèvre et Maine <i>Renowned for its clean fruit and zesty acidity, this "Sur Lie" Muscadet has superb depth of flavour due to extended lees contact</i>	France	2004
11	Sauvignon Blanc, Curicò Valley, Carmen <i>Sauvignon grapes have an apple freshness, reflected in this crisp, fresh wine from Chile's oldest winery, established in 1850</i>	Chile	2004
12	Chardonnay, Barossa Vines, Grant Burge <i>A gently oaked Chardonnay, whose ageing adds a little more depth and flavour to the fruity wine</i>	Australia	2004
13	Oppenheimer Krötenbrunnen, Riesling, <i>A gently sweet, yet full flavoured white. The wine is packed with ripe fruit flavours and coming from late picked grapes adds richness</i>	Germany	2002
14	Pinot Grigio, D O C, Trentino, i Mesi <i>One of the most popular grapes around. The Pinot Grigio has a lot of fruit and just a shaking of spice</i>	Italy	2005
15	Viognier, Ironstone Vineyards <i>Hailing from the Rhône valley, the somewhat rare Viognier grape has lots of character and is packed with fruit. Whilst dry it is not acidic</i>	California	2003
16	Gewurztraminer, Domaine Gocker, Alsace <i>Floral, aromatic and spicy ('Wurz' meaning spice) without being heavy - in fact, this wine has quite a light, fresh style</i>	France	2004
17	Sauvignon Blanc, Villa Maria, Marlborough <i>Classic New Zealand Sauvignon. Youthful, fresh and flavoursome with zippy acidity and an appealing herbaceous character</i>	N Zealand	2005
18	Chablis, Domaine Séguinot, Burgundy <i>Zesty, youthful and dry showing ripe tropical fruit flavours and a hint of freshly mown grass</i>	France	2003
19	Sancerre, Fournier Père et Fils, Loire <i>Delicate floral aromas with lively acidity and crisp, green apple characteristics; this is Loire Valley Sauvignon at its best</i>	France	2004
20	Chardonnay, Stellenbosch, Meerlust <i>This dry wine has a delicious citrus fruit flavour and fresh, lemony finish</i>	S Africa	2003

41	Chianti, D O C G, Tuscany, <i>This classic Tuscan wine is the local drink of Florence and Siena, fresh, fruity and tangy</i>	Italy	2004
42	Côtes du Rhône, Domaine de Panisse, Rhone <i>Modern style Rhône Valley wine, produced to give generous fruit and flavour with no harsh tannin</i>	France	2004
43	Pinotage, Stellenbosch, Hazendal <i>South Africa's own grape variety, a cross between Pinot Noir and Cinsault, makes light, fruity and easy drinking wines</i>	S Africa	2004
44	Merlot, Sonoma County, L de Lyeth <i>A new wave of gutsy, juicy and rich Merlots has arrived and this vibrantly fruity and chocolatey Californian is a fine example</i>	California	2003
45	Reserve Cabernet Sauvignon, Casa Lapostolle <i>Maximum emphasis on fruit extraction during vinification leads to a wine exploding with fruit. Beautifully balanced fruit enhances the wine</i>	Chile	2003
46	Reserva, Añares, Bodegas Olarra <i>Reserva wines spend longer in oak, this helps soften the harsher tannins making this quality of wine more appealing</i>	Spain	2001
47	Pinot Noir, Marlborough, Kim Crawford <i>A dark, smoky Pinot Noir with luscious berries, black cherries and spice. One of the best Pinot Noirs to emerge from New Zealand to date</i>	N Zealand	2004
48	Shiraz, Margaret River, Evans & Tate <i>A good Shiraz from the innovative Margaret River region, pepper and spice in perfect proportions, ripe fruit flavours and a long lingering finish</i>	Australia	2002
